






## DISCOVER YOURSELF!





#### **CHANDNI CHOWK -**


The reflection of the original Chandni Chowk used to shine in hence the name 'Chand', which means 'moon'. Today, it is one of the oldest and busiest markets in India.



#### **Qutab Minar**




Over 2000 years old, it is the tallest Brick Minaret In The World.




## Grand AGRA, FATEHPUR SIKRI

#### **Taj Mahal**



In 1632, the Mughal emperor Shah Jahan commissioned the building of the tomb of his favorite wife, Mumtaz Mahal, who died during childbirth. Completed in 1653, the Taj Mahal stands as a masterpiece of Mughal architecture, renowned worldwide for its symmetrical beauty, exquisite white marble craftsmanship, and enduring symbol of love.

#### **Agra Fort**



It was built by Shah Janan in 1628.
Several of the buildings are made of pure marble with beautiful carvings. To cool off the rooms in the marble pavilions, the walls were hollow and filled with running water. From the balconies in the pavilions, you have a nice view on the Yamuna river and the Taj Mahal.



#### **Tomb of Itimad-ud-Daula's**



This beautiful tomb situated on the banks of the Yamuna is also known as the 'baby Taj'. Built around 1625 AD, the carvings on this monument are said to be even better than that of the Taj.
